The Fred Shapiro, M.D. Visiting Professor

R. Lor Randall, M.D., FACS



R. Lor Randall, MD, FACS, is the Director of Sarcoma Services at the University of Utah's Huntsman Cancer Institute and Primary Children's Hospital. Dr. Randall is a Professor of Orthopaedics and The L.B. & Olive S. Young Endowed Chair for Cancer Research. He has a busy quaternary referral clinical practice specializing in musculoskeletal surgical oncology. Dr. Randall is also the Medical Director, Surgical Services at Huntsman Cancer Hospital and Co-Directs the Huntsman-Intermountain Adolescent

& Young Adult Oncology Program. As an active researcher, he coleads the Sarcoma Disease Oriented Research Team overseeing collaborative, across-department research budgets. The Sarcoma Services at HCI, because of its comprehensive experience in sarcomas, is continually developing and refining institutional based research and treatment protocols to improve the outcome in these rare but highly malignant conditions. HCI is a SARC participant and is also very active in the Children's Oncology Group.

Dr. Randall came to Huntsman Cancer Institute in 1998 after completing a fellowship in musculoskeletal oncology at the University of Washington-Fred Hutchinson-Seattle Children's Cancer Care Alliance. He graduated from Yale University School of Medicine in 1992 and completed a residency in orthopedic surgery at the University of California, San Francisco. Dr. Randall's clinical and research efforts have been recognized internationally. Among his honors, he is the recipient of the Association of Bone and Joint Surgeons' Musculoskeletal Tumor Society Scholar Award as well as Best Paper Award and has been invited as an American-British-Canadian Traveling Fellow. He has also been asked to speak internationally on a variety of sarcoma related topics. He is past president of the Connective Tissue Oncology Society and presently serves as the Chair of Orthopaedic Surgery for the Children's Oncology Group. He holds leadership positions in multiple national and international oncology and surgical societies including the National Comprehensive Cancer Network, Musculoskeletal Tumor Society, Children's Oncology Group, Interurban Orthopaedic Society and the Association of Bone and Joint Surgeons. He is a Fellow of the American College of Surgeons and is the author of hundreds of scientific manuscripts, book chapte rs and abstracts in the field of sarcoma surgery and biology.

FRED SHAPIRO, M.D., 1904-1976

Fred Shapiro, M.D. was born on August 14, 1904. He attended the University of Illinois and obtained his M.D. degree in 1931.

He was an intern at Cook County Hospital from 1930 to 1931. He was an Associate in Orthopedic Surgery at Cook County Hospital from 1931 to 1941. He joined the Marine Corp and served from 1941 to 1945 in the South Pacific. He was discharged as a Captain. He received the Legion of Honor in combat and a presidential Unit Citation.

Dr. Shapiro was an attending Orthopedic Surgeon at Cook County Hospital from 1945 until his death on August 5, 1976. He was an Associate at the Central Free Dispensary from 1931.

His academic appointment included Clinical Assistant from 1931-1941, Instructor 1945-1946, Assistant Clinical Professor, Associate Clinical Professor at the University of Illinois, and an Associate Professor of Orthopedic Surgery at Rush-Presbyterian-St. Luke's Medical Center.

In 1976, Dr. Fred Shapiro became a Professor Emeritus in the Department of Orthopedic Surgery at Rush-Presbyterian-St. Luke's Medical Center. He was instrumental in developing the Cook County Hospital as an Orthopedic Teaching Unit. He was in charge of that program for several years. He developed the University Residency Affiliated Orthopedic Program there.

Each year an outstanding, world renowned, Orthopedic Surgeon is chosen to be The Fred Shapiro, M.D. Distinguished Visiting Professor. This year R. Lor Randall, M.D. has the honor.
